## Winnsboroan to conduct 70-day tour of Europe

Johnny Nabors of Austin, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Nabors of Winnsboro, will serve as conductor of a 70-day tour of Europe sponsored by the Texas Union.

The annual tour, especially designed for University of Texas students, will leave Montreal June 5 with the sailing of the Cunard liner SS Carinthia and will end August 13 with the arrival of an Air France jetliner in New York.

Johnny, a lecturer in the UT department of general business, will share the escort duties with former UT sweetheart Jessica Darling.

The tour leaves Montreal aboard the Carinthia for a seven-day Atlantic voyage, arriving June 12 in Liverpool. During the voyage study periods will be available, including historical background of places to be visited, with special instruction in language, history and art.

Outstanding stopovers will include Shakespeare's birthplace at Stratford-on-Avon, three days in London, and continental trips to Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, France and Spain.

The tour's package price includes transportation, courier service, hotels, most meals, tips, taxes, baggage and sightseeing.

The Texas Union, sponsor of the tour, is a student-supported recreational and cultural organization for UT students, staff and faculty members.
